

Dear Pilgrim members and friends,

I have many strong church memories from my youth, but none quite as strong as my remembering having attended midweek Lenten services with my family. (That I remember these services well may mean that I have a “personal penchant for penitence,” though I don’t believe I’m at all overly-preoccupied with the call to confession!) These were to me somber services with a mood quite in contrast with the usual uplifting and inspiring Sunday worship to which I was accustomed, and I felt the nave itself was more dimly lighted for evening midweek worship during Lent. Yes, these were services held after sunset, so there was no light shining in through the stained-glass windows. But the interior darkness felt to me stronger than would have been true for only the reason just stated.

I do not recall the sermons being especially somber, or in any way stressing too greatly the need for those gathered to be seeking God’s redress for their/our sinful ways. The sermons I recall spoke more of Jesus’ sacrifice on the cross than they did of human waywardness and error (though some of this latter was, of course, included!). The somber mood of those midweek services wasn’t because of the sermons, or the darkness. No, the mood and feeling had far more to do with the people present and the music than with the sermon, or the lighting.

The people present were certainly more long-faced, more serious-looking than they were on Sundays! And they were less conversant and far more focused on their worship than on each other. To be honest, I’m not sure how much I understood about Lent in those days, but I could tell from looking at the people present – the adults, especially – that this was not at all a jovial, light-hearted matter: we were all together on a demanding, risky journey with Jesus, a journey toward that hill outside Jerusalem, and the farther along we went, the more it appeared that things were going to turn out for the worst for Him!

Even though the pastor in his sermon wasn’t highly-accusatory; wasn’t pointing and wagging his finger at the congregation; wasn’t telling people that it was

because of their faults and because of their most grievous sins that Jesus was about to suffer terribly and die, I just had the feeling that many people did indeed feel that way! I could see it in the expressions on their faces. These midweek Lenten services were a serious look at what Jesus had done – the length to which He had gone – to insure forgiveness and salvation for his people! You could see it in peoples’ faces, and you could hear it in the music!



On Sunday mornings, the organ sounded jubilant and celebrative, lively and joyful! But at those midweek Lenten services, that very same organ played a much different tune. It had an entirely different sound: plaintive and even grave-sounding; not quite like a dirge, but certainly with hints of gloom and darkness. The music and the hymns expressed determination and strength, but also a certain level of anguish and pain! Still, this was a journey we were destined to make – despite its intensity, despite the suffering of Our Lord, we belonged with Him, and we belonged to Him, and we were where we were supposed to be!


Lenten Reflections by Kathy Bloom

Taking Time with God! That is what lent is all about. The season of lent is coming soon. It is important for all of us to take some extra time to talk to God during this season. Lent is a time for reflection and soul searching, a time of penitence and prayer with an eye of faith toward Easter morn. Lent also includes a time for prayers of praise and thanksgiving. We need to let nothing disturb us while we contemplate the wondrous Lenten theme. We must open our hearts to Him who went from Gethsemane to Golgatha so that we might go from earth to heaven. There is a Lutheran hymn that states this idea: “Jesus, I will ponder now on your holy passion; let your Sprit now endow me for meditation. Grant that I in love and faith may the image cherish of your suff’ring, pain, and death, that I may not perish. Take Time with God! “Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning; Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord, your God. For gracious and merciful is He, slow to anger, rich in kindness, and relenting in punishment.” (Joel 2: 12-13) God is a kind and just God as shown in the prior passage. Who would not want to spend more time with Him? Lent is a time when we can contemplate our relationship with God, as well as, remembering Christ’s sacrifice. It is a time when we can reflect on what the Lord has done for us and express our love to our Savior. We can meditate with awe and thanksgiving on the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Lent is a journey which centers on prayer. This journey goes first to the foot of the cross, then to the empty tomb where we witnessed the greatest miracle we could ever hope for which occurs on Easter Sunday. Each day during Lent we can take a quiet, reflective step along this inspiring journey.

The word “lent” originally meant spring-not only a reference to the season before Easter, But also an invitation to a spring time for the soul. Forty days to cleanse our system and open our eyes to God’s love for us. Forty days to remember and reflect on what it is like to live by the grace of God alone and not by what we can supply by ourselves. May we use this precious time to ask the Lord for guidance during our Lenten journey and follow the leading of His Holy Spirit in preparation to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

TAX EFFICIENT WAYS TO SUPPORT PILGRIM (INCLUDING THE GENERAL FUND, OR THE ORGAN CAMPAIGN)

On December 18, 2015, a new federal law was enacted that contains a number of tax-related provisions. I am delighted to report that the law makes permanent the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA. The benefits of this type of gift are described below:

Suppose Frank is 75 years old and has a traditional IRA with \$400,000. The IRS rules require Frank to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) each year, which is subject to ordinary income tax on his 1040. His RMD this year is \$17,467.25. He doesn't need all of his RMD to support his lifestyle, and he has other sources of income. Frank would like to make a contribution to Pilgrim.

Frank can direct his IRA administrator to distribute any amount up to \$100,000 directly to Pilgrim from his IRA. Suppose Frank directs a QCD of \$5,000 to Pilgrim. This amount will be completely excluded from Frank's income, resulting in lower taxable income for Frank. Also, QCD amounts are counted in determining whether the IRA owner has met his RMD. If Frank excludes the \$5,000 from his income this year, he may not take a charitable contribution deduction of \$5,000. I would note that a taxpayer who does not itemize his deductions typically sees no tax benefit of a charitable contribution (although we all know there are spiritual and emotional benefits for the donor, and tangible benefit for the donee organization). Any taxpayer, including those who do not itemize, would see tax benefit of a QCD because it lowers taxable income.

This law has been made permanent! Hooray! We used to have to wait around at the end of the year to see if this benefit would be renewed, but now, we know the law allows it for 2016 and going forward.


Here are a couple of qualifiers:

1. Only those taxpayers over 70.5 years of age can take advantage of the QCD.
2. Only distributions from traditional IRAs are eligible for QCD treatment. Not SEP IRAs, ROTH IRAs, 401ks or other employer-sponsored plans.
3. Funds must be transferred directly from the IRA administrator to the eligible charity. If it stops in the taxpayer's hands first, then it's not a QCD that can be excluded. The taxpayer will have to include the income on his 1040 and take a charitable deduction, which he may not see the full benefit of (depending on what else is happening on his return).

If you have any questions about this idea, I would be happy to answer them if I can. Importantly, however, I encourage you to discuss your objectives and the tax consequences of any transaction with your CPA in advance of the transaction.

ORGAN FUND UPDATE






