# "From the Elders" Which Road Will You Take?



Well, it is finally June! The long Indiana winter is over. The sun is shining and the days are warm and long. School is out and it is time for vacation! Many of us are planning on road trips to the lakes, mountains, or beaches.

But which road will you take? In our family, the traditional vacation is a road trip to the lakes in northern Minnesota. But we always have to make the difficult decision whether to take the short route through Chicago, or avoid the traffic and Take I-74 through Champaign and Bloomington in Illinois. When we lived near Los Angeles in California and wanted to take a road trip to San Francisco, the decision was between the high road over the mountains through Tejon pass on I-5 or the coastal low road on US 101.

Will you take the high road or the low road?

For thousands of years, the concept of road, way, highway, or path has been a metaphor for the decision we take in our spiritual journey.....that is our walk with God. Will we believe and accept the free gift of Jesus' atoning work on the cross, live a God focused life, and enjoy eternal life on the high road? Or will we be focused on our worldly and carnal desires and walk the low road to death? The Bible and even historical literature are filled with such metaphorical references to roads and highways.

For example, following the defeat of Scotland's Bonnie Prince Charlie by the army of King George II at Culloden in 1746, an unknown Scottish poet wrote a famous song eventually called "The Bonnie Banks o' Loch Lomond." The most famous lyrics are the second chorus:

"O ye'll tak' the high road, and I'll tak' the low road, And I'll be in Scotland afore ye. But me and my true love will never meet again, On the bonnie, bonnie banks of Loch Lomond."

Many interpret the lyrics to refer to the captured clans who were taken to London and tried for treason. Those who were found not guilty took the high road to life back in Edinburgh. The convicted were executed and took the low road (death) back to Scotland. The Bible has hundreds of references to roads, ways, highways, and paths. Recall the disciples' journey along the road to Emmaus with Jesus discussing his death and resurrection and how it was necessary for us to live. We also remember Jesus riding the colt of a donkey along the road from the Mount of Olives to Jerusalem as predicted in Zechariah 9:9:

"...thy King cometh unto thee; He is just, and having salvation; lowly, riding upon an ass."

One of my favorite Biblical references to ways and highways is the prophecy of the Lord's advent in Isaiah 40:1-4. The familiar lyrics from the beginning of Handel's Messiah are based on this scripture:

"Comfort ye, comfort ye my people, saith your God. Speak ye comfortably to Jerusalem, and cry unto her, that her warfare is accomplished, that her iniquity is pardoned. The voice of Him that crieth in the wilderness: Prepare ye the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God." "Every valley shall be exalted, and every mountain and hill made low, the crooked straight, and the rough places plain."

Is the low road the easy road? I think that the pain and burdens of bad decisions and unforgiven sin are hardly easy!

Is it a great burden to follow Jesus and take the high road to life? Although Jesus says in Luke 9:23 "If any of you wants to be my follower, you must turn from your selfish ways, take up your cross daily, and follow me," he also promises an easy yoke and light burdens in Matthew 11:29-30. Again Handel's lyrics at the end of The Messiah Part 1 paraphrase this scripture:

"Come unto Him, all ye that labor, that are heavy laden, and He shall give you rest. Take His yoke upon you, and learn of Him; for he is meek and lowly of heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls." "His yoke is easy, and His burden is light."

As a young man, before I became a Christian, I was on the low road to death. The challenges of earthly life seemed insurmountable and the path to salvation and eternal life was unknown. But, then my life turned around when I came to know Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior. I stepped up to the high road. The path to both my earthly life and my eternal life became very clear. And I found that His yoke is easy and His burden is light.
