The events in the last several months of my life have caused me to re-evaluate my life. I have asked the question, "What plans does our Lord Jesus Christ have for me?"

After having my quadruple bypass operation last October, I realized that the Lord is and has been watching over me my entire life. When I was having the cardiac catheterization procedure, the doctor exclaimed, "Why is this guy still alive?" I had no chest pain, no shortness of breath, or any other symptoms that could reveal the problem. I had continued rigorous activity including a 66-mile bike ride against a strong headwind, and helping unload a truck at a food bank just days before my surgery. I believe strongly that the only reason that I am still here is due to the power and grace of Almighty God. Why me, Lord? Sinful being that I am, I have failed You time and time again. I do not know what plans You have for me, but Your infinite wisdom transcends my poor power to understand. I had always realized that God loved me in spite of my shortcomings, but this was the ultimate evidence of such love.

I have always loved God and been grateful for His gift of life and gift of His Son Jesus Christ, who through His death has given us forgiveness of our sins and salvation. The creation of the universe is yet again more evidence of God's love for us. We are created in the image of God, but sometimes we do not realize what that really means. I believe that if we are created in God's image, then we should love one another as God loves us. We are called upon in our own little spheres of influence to be as little "Christs." We are to spread the good news that God so loved the world that he gave His only begotten Son to die for us so that through Him we have eternal life. I also believe that just as Christ suffered death for our sakes, we are called to suffer as well. It is through that suffering that we can grow in compassion for those around us who are in misery. We are therefore better

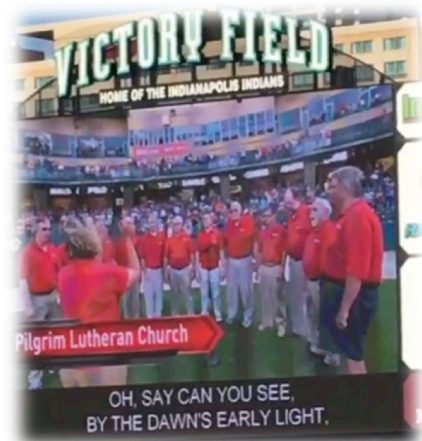

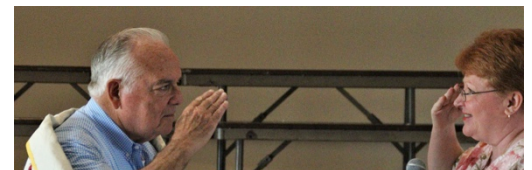
SUPER SENIORS

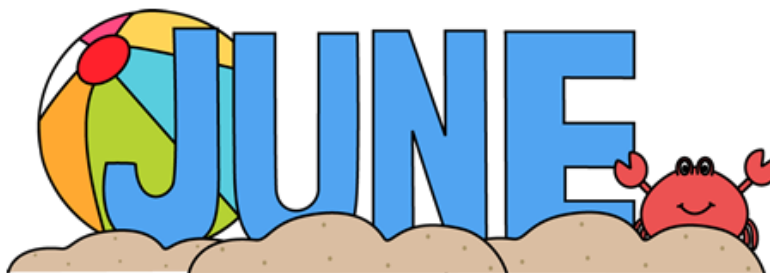

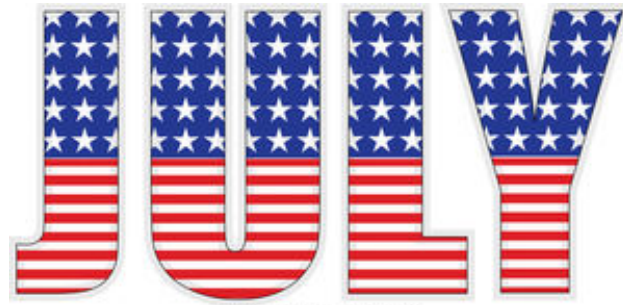
