WHAT'S UP IN WORSHIP? We continue in the season of Epiphany, where our scriptures and music have a *leitmotiv*—a recurring musical concept throughout a long piece. The *leitmotiv* for us is light, in the sense that Jesus comes to us to be a light in this dark world. We sing "We are Marching in the Light of God" and "I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light". The organ prelude also reflects that light-motive. It is a bit unusual—I would be hard pressed to come up with another organ work that is dedicated to epiphany but is not an arrangement of a common epiphany hymn. This little-known organ piece, by twentieth-century French composer Maurice Duruflé, was written in the early 1960s and is based on the Gregorian chant Introit for the Mass of Epiphany. Duruflé takes the ancient irregular rhythm of the Gregorian chant and turns it into a rather modern sounding composition.
