FROM THE ELDERS

THE IMPORTANCE OF CHRISTIAN DISCIPLINES

"Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may get the prize. And everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They, then, do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. Therefore I run in such a way, as not without aim; I do not fight like a man beating the air; but I **discipline** my body and make it my slave, lest possibly, after I have preached to others, I myself should be disqualified for the prize." (I Cor. 9: 24-27)

I always am amazed at the opening ceremonies of the Olympic Games, and this year was no exception. The unbelievable majesty and awesome effects the host countries are able to put together to thrill the audience and the participating athletes is quite a spectacle, worthy of all the hard

work the individual athletes must endure to be able to qualify. But the real prize is found at the end of each competition as the gold medal winner takes the podium, receives the medal, and listens to his or her national anthem being played while tears of joy stream down the faces of all involved. A truly elite athlete doesn't just start his training a few months before the games; it is usually a lifetime of sacrifice and training that has started in childhood and during which all other endeavors—education, socialization, entertainment—are sacrificed for the purpose of transforming the athlete physically. But even with all the pomp and circumstance, the moments are so fleeting, and the prize is so temporal. Even the gold, silver, and bronze will someday tarnish and the moments of exultation will be gone.

In the scripture passage above, St. Paul sets up an analogy between the need for surrendering one's rights for the sake of others and an athletic competition. According to one commentary, "Paul may have had in mind the Isthmian Games, held every third year in Corinth, second in prominence only to the Olympic Games in Athens. Contestants had to provide proof that they had trained for 10 months, had to exercise in the gymnasium for 30 days before the games started, and only then could they compete. Only the winners received a reward, a 'perishable wreath,' which, in the first century, was made of celery and would wilt as soon as it was awarded. Paul never just

The Greek word in this verse for **discipline** means, "to deliver a knockout blow," and **make it my slave** may reflect the practice of the victor leading his beaten opponents around the arena amidst the applause of the spectators. Paul determined to subdue his body (inside and out) to be the most effective in serving the Lord. **So that, having preached to others, I myself should not be disqualified...** does not mean that Paul feared he might lose his salvation if he did not adequately control himself. The disqualification here refers to forfeiting the chance to serve *effectively* in the great gospel mission."

We, too, have been given the opportunity—rather, the mandate – by Christ to participate in the great gospel mission. We, too, like the Olympic athletes must take up the serious training it will take to effectively participate in God's mission to the entire world. And, like an elite athlete, we must realize that to serve effectively will take the training of our entire self – spirit, soul, and body. As Pastor John reminded us a few weeks ago, we all will be asked to discipline ourselves during this Lenten season. Traditionally, this has involved the practice of the disciplines, such as prayer, silence and solitude, meditation under the Word, fasting, and sacrificial giving. While Jesus followers undertake these disciplines during Lent, they are not meant to be an end in themselves, nor confined to the 40 days of Lent. They are intended to help the follower of Jesus to be transformed by the work of the Holy Spirit for the express purpose of being able to effectively participate in the mission of God, to "Go and make disciples of all nations...." In order to do that, we must first take up the purposeful work of making disciples of ourselves, and that involves discipline. But Christ reminds us that to answer the call to discipleship does not mean we are to take on a self-improvement program by ourselves. No, Scripture reminds us of the forgotten truth that the transformation to Christlikeness is realized through taking on the "easy yoke" of Jesus, pulling the load with Him. True Christlikeness comes from true companionship with Christ. "Come to me all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." May we all find purposeful rest in the yoke of Jesus during this season of Lent. Let it be so. Amen.


CHILDREN'S CORNER
