ADULT CHRISTIAN ED CLASSES CONTINUE-Tim Schurr's class on Jesus' Teaching Style continues through March 24. On March 31, Pastor Paul Schumacher will begin a three-week study of Christian Faith and Everyday Life in the Image of God. Below is the description of his class.

Beginning with Scripture and the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds (180 and 325 A.D.), St. Augustine's brief work On the Trinity and Luther's three Articles on the meaning of the Creeds in his Small Catechism, we will discuss how best to bring together Christian identity with Modern Identity. The three Adult Bible Classes taught by Pastor Paul on March 31 and April 7 and 14 will address several of life's basic questions: What makes us individual Christians unique in our modern world? How can we modern believers make sense of our lives spiritually when we feel emptiness, lack of purpose, or loss of self-esteem? Christian Faith suggests that life's big questions already have been answered by a loving God who not only created us, but redeemed us, making us children of God. Our Christian Faith assures us that "Eternal Life" is not only life after death, but Eternal Life is a possibility right now. It is a quality of life, a blessedness and richness and abundance of life that begins now, later to be perfected in the mansions of heaven.
