WHAT'S UP IN WORSHIP

LESSONS IN SUSTENANCE...In our gospel for today, we have a timely lesson for all gardeners who are seeing their gardens begin to wake up from winter dormancy. The gospel includes the parable of the fruitless fig tree. As a gardener myself I know that situation well-a plant that, for no obvious reason, has not performed the way I hoped it would. In my experience, neither sweet talk ("Please bloom, you sweet lovely plant") or ultimatums ("Bloom this season or else!") do any good. Often the plant has to be "edited" from my garden (and then rescued by my spouse who nurtures it back to life.) This parable is included in the Lenten lectionary to get us thinking about life, death, and resurrection. Our other scriptures today use images of sustenancefood and drink, water and bread. Our choir will sing "Come, All Who Thirst" and we will sing "You Satisfy the Hungry Heart" during communion. Christ is our life, our sustenance, and our eternal hope. ~Sarah Williams

ADULT CHRISTIAN ED CLASSES CONTINUE-Tim Schurr's class on Jesus' Teaching Style concludes today. Next Sunday, March 31, Pastor Paul Schumacher will begin a three-week study of Christian Faith and Everyday Life in the Image of God. Below is the description of his class.

Beginning with Scripture and the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds (180 and 325 A.D.), St. Augustine's brief work On the Trinity and Luther's three Articles on the meaning of the Creeds in his Small Catechism, we will discuss how best to bring together Christian identity with Modern Identity. The three Adult Bible Classes taught by Pastor Paul on March 31 and April 7 and 14 will address several of life's basic questions: What makes us individual Christians unique in our modern world? How can we modern believers make sense of our lives spiritually when we feel emptiness, lack of purpose, or loss of self-esteem? Christian Faith suggests that life's big questions already have been answered by a loving God who not only created us, but redeemed us, making us children of God. Our Christian Faith assures us that "Eternal Life" is not only life after death, but Eternal Life is a possibility right now. It is a quality of life, a blessedness and

richness and abundance of life that begins now, later to be perfected in the mansions of heaven.
