

HAMILTON COUNTY CROP WALK

The annual Hamilton County CROP Walk will be held on Sunday, October 4. Pilgrim has a proud tradition of participation in this Church World Service event, and once again we will be one of 20 local congregations of various faiths raising money and awareness for the problem of world hunger. The goal this year is \$36,000, with 25% of the money collected going directly to Hamilton County agencies. The walk (not a race) begins at 1:30PM at the Carmel Gazebo and covers 3.7 miles, much of which is on the Monon Trail.

We walk in the faith of our Lord when He told us in Matthew 25 & 26 "I was hungry and you gave me something to eat ... whatever you do for the least of these people of mine, you do for me." May we remember the following prayer offered by Canaan Banana from Zimbabwe:

Open my eyes that they may see the deepest needs of the people.

Move my hands that they may feed the hungry. Touch my heart that it may bring warmth to the

despairing.

Every year of history is eventful and memorable for someone, and 1955 was no exception for people in the United States. In 1955, U.S. military involvement with South Vietnam began, with the sending of the U. S. Military Assistance Advisory Group. "MAAG," as it was known, was charged with training soldiers of the South Vietnamese Army in their struggle with forces from North Vietnam. This conflict would expand greatly over the next two decades, eventually leading to major American military involvement in widespread combat, and leading to the deaths of more than 58,000 Americans, 1955-1975.

1955 was also a memorable year in the civil rights movement in America. In that year Emmett Till, a fourteen year-old African-American from Chicago, was brutally beaten and murdered in Money, Mississippi, reportedly for having shown disrespect for a white woman – an event which sparked considerable public outrage and protest. And it was also in 1955 that Rosa Parks, an African-American seamstress in Montgomery, Alabama, was arrested for refusing to give up her bus seat to a white man. This was the event which led to the "Montgomery Bus Boycott," organized by the Montgomery Improvement Association, and which choose as its leader a young Baptist beginnings as a Christian worshipping community! pastor, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who would go on to become a national leader in the civil rights movement.

1955 was also the year that the phrase, "In God We Trust," began appearing on all U. S. paper currency. Coca Cola was first marketed in cans in 1955; prior to that, Coke was only sold in bottles. Grocery stores across the United States began selling frozen "TV dinners" in 1955, and Ray Kroc's first McDonald's restaurant opened in Des Plaines, Illinois that same year. (The McDonald brothers, Maurice and Richard, had first opened their restaurant fifteen years earlier in San Bernardino, California.)

Memorable television programs debuted in 1955, including "Gunsmoke," "The Mickey Mouse Club," and "The \$64,000 Question," a popular game show Alan Goertemiller that was cancelled in 1958 after it was revealed that Pastor

And yes, it was in 1955, sixty years ago, on the last Sunday of October, Reformation Sunday, that Pilgrim Lutheran Church of Indianapolis, Inc., had its That first service was in the riding club building on the Charles Gregg family farm, and Darrell Pike's father, Mr. Don Pike, was the organist. Pilgrim continued to worship in that building until the first church building, near N. Meridian St. and 103rd Street, was completed and dedicated - in July 1957. (The Gregg family had sold some of their farm property to Pilgrim in 1954, property upon which that first building was located.)

Our "60 Days of Service - 60 Years of Blessings" are worth celebrating!

Discernment by Doug Lippert, Head Elder

"Prayerful consideration." "I'll ask the Holy Spirit to guide me." "Let me pray about that and I'll let you know."

We are called to take everything to God in prayer. Not just our petitions, not our "get me out of this one, please, God" please nor any other sole communication with God.

Everything.

Which is great, except how do you know that your prayer has been answered and that you have clear, identifiable discernment regarding the direction you might take that will most connect you with God?

For centuries, I'm sure, persons have been asking this question. I know I have been asking for decades. And while I don't have *the* answer, I have learned a few things that might aid you, as you endeavor to take everything to God in prayer.

I know that more time is better than less time. To pray diligently over a decision over a period of days or weeks or, in the event of a large decision such as a job change, months; quiets my heart and helps me attune to the nudge I feel from God. The more frequently I place my request for direction before God, the easier comes His bump regarding the direction in which I should head.

I've learned that what I want isn't always what God wants and that if I try to fit what I want into my seeking it feels like a square peg in a round hole, because that's what it is. Rationalization is sometimes easy, but doesn't come without conscience's pang. Taking time to quiet my heart and really listen for an answer helps dispel my tendency to justify or rationalize.

Finally, I've noticed that if I do a little "God spotting," that is really keeping my eyes open, my ears attuned and my mind receptive, I can find God's discernment for me in most amazing ways. The encounters I have, the emails that come my way and my thoughts will often align themselves in a way that causes me to raise my eyebrows and think "so *that's* what you've been trying to tell me, huh God?"


And, then, sometimes God just wallops me along side of the head and, after recovering, I say to myself "Oh, now I get it." But...a faithful following of the three ideas above can help spare me the frying pan in the head feeling that God has sometimes used on me to overcome my clogged ears, scaly eyes and closed mind.

I encourage you to be diligent about earnest prayer, which I advise for my sake as well as yours. Quiet your heart in ways that work for you in order to allow the Holy Spirit to do its work. Take everything to God in prayer, no matter how trivial it seems to you. A God who knows the number of hairs on your head already knows your heart and, most importantly, what is best for you.

Prayer. Discernment. Obedience.



ANNOUNCING PILGRIM'S NEW PIPE ORGAN

Pilgrim's new pipe organ is now officially in the works! On Friday, August 28th, we signed a contract with John-Paul Buzard Pipe Organ Builders of Champaign, Illinois to build us a 35 rank pipe organ. It should be completed and installed January of 2017.

I hope to use a little corner of Pilgrim's Progress each month to keep you updated on the progress being made, and to fill you in on "behind the scenes" details, so-to-speak. Please don't hesitate to ask me questions about this exciting project.

The Basics

This organ already has a name— Opus 45. Opus is Latin for "work" and is how organ builders (and many classical composers) organize and list their works—organs or compositions. Opus 45 means this is the forty-fifth organ John-Paul Buzard has built. He has been in business since 1985, and his instruments are growing in popularity.

There were two reasons John-Paul Buzard Pipe Organ Builders were chosen by the organ search committee: his organs stood out amongst the top organ building firms in the nation. His organs had exceptionally beautiful sounds and an overall "singing" quality that other cream of the crop organ firms did not have, and what we were looking for. Secondly, Champaign Illinois is two hours away—our committee felt that this level of quality and talent being near Pilgrim was important. We are pouring money into our regional economy, instead of paying an organ firm in Canada or thousands of miles away.

If you are interested in hearing sample sounds from Buzard organs, and learning more about the company, visit www.buzardorgans.com. Fairly soon they should put up an announcement about our organ under their "current projects" heading.

We happened to move forward on this project at the ideal time this summer. After we signed our Letter of Intention, two other churches have since queued up for new organs which means their wait time will be significantly longer than ours.

Each pipe organ is built one at a time, and literally by hand. Why by hand instead of some factory-assembled prototype system? Each pipe organ must be designed for the space it inhabits, and church sanctuaries all have different attributes—from size, height, acoustic properties, and space dedicated for an organ. John-Paul is currently finishing work on an organ for an Episcopal church in Sandusky, Ohio.

However, progress has started on our organ. They are beginning schematic drawings (far more in depth than the colored rendering we have). The pipes are being ordered. The metal pipes will come from Freiburg,

Germany, south of Stuttgart. They are made by a family owned company which supplies organ pipes to builders around the world. American organ builders order their metal pipes from Europe because American pipe manufacturers have never quite mastered the quality the Europeans can get from their pipes. The wooden pipes will be made from lumber grown in the northeastern U.S.

This organ's basic design is that of a free-standing case with organ pipes inside. You can see from the drawing that there are a lot of "chevrons" in the design—they match our chevrons in the chancel's stained glass windows. The pedal towers (the two ends of the organ and center pipes) will be jutting out from the organ case at a 45 degree angle, mimicking the triangular light fixtures in the sanctuary (it is hard to tell that from a two dimensional drawing.) The case will be solid oak to match our white oak. The pipes on the bottom are the softer pipes and the pipes on the top are louder and what will be used to accompany hymn singing.



Next month we will start looking at the components of this new organ—the different kind of pipes and parts.

A fundraising campaign will be underway to raise the remaining funds needed for this organ.




