TODAY IS GLOBAL MISSION SUNDAY HERE AT

PILGRIM. Global Mission "nurtures the ELCA's world engagement through the theology and practice of accompaniment by walking together with our global companions. Our work together has a multi-faceted approach to mission, from sending missionaries and personnel, to offering grants and scholarships designed to strengthen global church leadership and to support the ministries of companions". We welcome today Mae Helen Johnson. She works in Global Mission in the ELCA Churchwide Office and was a Young Adult in Global Mission (affectionately called a YAGM) a couple of years ago. She is with us today to assist us in celebrating the global vision of what it means to be the people of God. She will be available after the liturgy in the narthex for questions and conversations and will be with the youth and confirmands during the Education hour. In our liturgy today we will be singing hymns from a variety of global origins as a way of reminding ourselves that we part of something larger than ourselves and the connection in Christ to our sisters and brothers throughout the world.

Five Centuries of Mystery and Paradox:

How Lutherans Live with Unanswerable Questions Christian theology has always held to nonsensical assertions. A gruesome crucifixion proved the best news ever. Christ is one person, fully God and completely human. God is both one and three.

This anniversary series will examine Lutheran theology's distinctive embrace of additional paradoxes, thanks to its insistence that the church's response to every difficult, important question must, above all else. honor the death of Christ as necessary and sufficient for our salvation and also offer comfort to penitent hearts.

TODAY – Christ's Descent to Hell: How did this line in the Apostles' Creed originate, and what does it mean? October 22 - Predestination: Calvin taught that God, from eternity, predestines every soul, some to heaven, some to hell. Lutherans responded, "Not so fast!" Why?

October 29 - The Problem of Evil: How can evil exist and even thrive in the creation of an all-powerful, good God?
