GUEST PREACHER TODAY—Pastor Murdaugh is a graduate of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO, with an M.Div. and M.Th. In his 40 years of ministry he's serviced congregations in AR, LA, MS, and GA. He has held various positions in the LCMS, and currently serves in the FL/GA District as Circuit Visitor, District Reconciler and Stewardship Committee. He has decades of experience in short term mission work in Mexico, China, Europe, India, and with Hispanics, Koreans, Ethiopians, Eretrians and Sudanese in the U.S. He is a founding member of the Chirala Medical & Educational Trust, Inc., and serves as CFO of the Board. Pastor Murdaugh is with us to share the work he and his partners have been doing the past 15 years in Chirala, Andhra Pradesh, India, with the revitalization and ongoing mission of Baer Christian Hospital-a Lutheran mission hospital whose history dates back to 1909 when it was opened by Dr. Mary Baer, a Lutheran missionary doctor from OH. The mission and ministry of Baer Christian Hospital includes an outpatient clinic reaching hundreds of people a week. The mission also houses and supports two evangelism and church planter training schools; and an orphanage and ministry to the poor street children of Chirala.

Pilgrim Garden Update—After a rough start this spring, the garden eventually came around with abundant harvests of cucumbers, beans, eggplant, tomatoes, and a few peppers late in the summer. Hopefully you've sampled some of the last of the tomato crop available in the narthex over the past few weeks. A special thanks to John and Noel Shilling and Jenny Pitts for handling many of the deliveries this year. We've been alternating between the Hamilton County Food Bank in Noblesville (Mondays) and The Sharing Place in Franklin (Thursdays). This biweekly schedule seems to work well with the volume of produce coming out of the garden. The produce is always well received, (especially the eggplant!). The time has come for fall cleanup and to complete installation of the fence. Beginning this Saturday for the next few Saturdays, we'd welcome help to get us ready for next spring. We'll plan to start at 8:00 a.m/ and work only for a couple of hours. We'd love to see the return of Pilgrim's "Stump Removal Squad" that was assembled the day of the Gaga Pit assembly \Box , as another stump needs to go before the fence can go up. As with any project we're making adjustments after each year. Although we can't control the weather, we can adjust the veggies we plant and the timing. Most importantly, communication can be improved. I'm thinking that a group texting (rather than the bulletin board and/or email) will be the most effective way to let volunteers know what tasks are most important as the summer progresses. We could really use more "workers in the vineyard", especially with picking and weeding. Other than certain scheduled events (eg. planting) your time in the garden would be on your own. Let me know if you'd like to be included on the group text and contribute to this important part of Pilgrim's Social Ministry.
