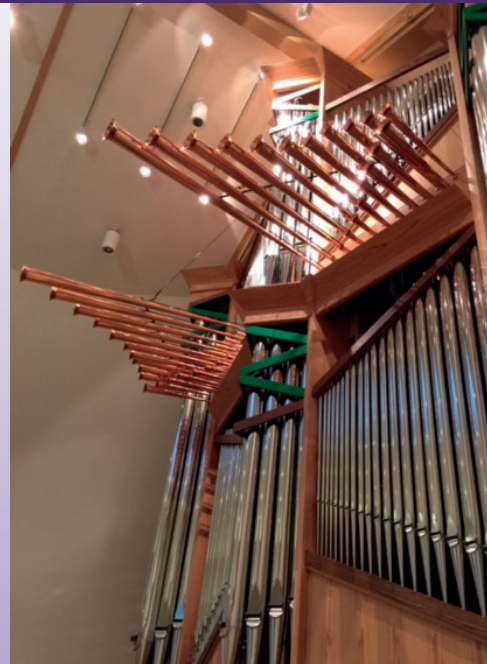
Four local organists join forces to perform a program of varied organ music, spanning the ages and styles. They will show off all the beautiful and diverse sounds of Pilgrim's new organ. A free-will offering will be taken.

Timothy Denton received his Bachelor's Degree in organ performance from the University of Louisville and his Master's Degree in organ performance and church music from Indiana University, Bloomington. His teachers include Melvin Dickinson and Larry Smith. He currently serves as Organist / Director of Music at St. Alban's Episcopal Church in Indianapolis. Mr. Denton is also a published composer.

Travis Person studied with Dr. Marilyn Keiser as a student at Indiana University where he earned the Master of Music degree in Organ and Church Music. He received the Bachelor of Arts degree in Music from Augustana University in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Travis holds positions at St. Timothy's Episcopal Church, St. Mark Catholic Church, and Indianapolis Hebrew Congregation. Travis is a member of the Association of Anglican Musicians and the American Guild of Organists (Indianapolis Chapter) where he serves as Sub-Dean.

Dawn Waddell is the Chapel Organist at Second Presbyterian Church, and also works as a substitute organist. She holds a Bachelors of Music in organ from Oberlin Conservatory, where she studied with Garth Peacock, and a Graduate Performance Diploma in organ from Peabody Conservatory, where she studied with Donald Sutherland. She completed her studies at Indiana University, earning a Masters of Music in organ under Larry Smith, with a Church Music cognate. She is a member of the American Guild of Organists.

Sarah Williams received a Bachelor of Music degree in organ performance from St. Olaf College studying with John Ferguson and a Master's Degree in organ performance from Indiana University studying with Larry Smith. She is Cantor to the Congregation (music director/choir director/organist) at Pilgrim Lutheran Church. She is a member of the American Guild of Organists and ALCM (Association of Lutheran Church Musicians).
