Dear Progressing Pilgrims,

At one time I worked for a funeral home as a driver of the family limousine or more often the coach. There was one thing I



noticed; not a single one of the coaches had a trailer-hitch for a U-Haul. The same fate awaits all of us. None of us are getting out of this life alive and we will not be taking with us anything we accumulated during our brief stent here. What does that tell you about stuff we think valuable? There is the temptation to believe our worth is determined by our things.

In a recent sermon I briefly touched upon the question about how society determines our value based on our work and productivity. All too often we buy into those narrow and often wrong assessments. Why is it that we derive our worth by how hard we work or what we've managed to accumulate? It has been said, that no one on their death bed ever said, "I wish I had spent more time at work." We work so much for that which in time will be just dust in the wind.

Why do we labor so much for that which society says we need to have importance? What do our children value? Do they remember their parents for all the extra hours they worked or by their attendance at their games or concerts or birthdays? You know the answer to that one.

The sermon I reference above was about Sabbath and that Sabbath was intended to remind us we are God's creations and that is where our value, our worth resides. What matters is the legacy of love and influence on the lives of others.

You see Sabbath is more than a day of the week; it is an understanding of our identity and value. We love our children, not for what they do, but for who they are to us. The same is true for our value to God.

Remember you are a child of God and if you need a reminder of that, trace the cross that was placed on your forehead at your baptism. Let's continue on the Pilgrim journey together.

ORGAN FUND UPDATE

On 7/29/16, several organ committee members participated in a 'field trip' to John-Paul Buzard Pipe Organ Builders in Champaign. It was exciting to see how our new organ is coming together. The organ console where Sarah will be seated is completely assembled. The organ case that will house the pipes is partially completed. All the organ pipes (2,130 pipes!!) are in the shop, and the 'voicing' of those pipes has begun - meaning each individual pipe is hand adjusted to play the exact pitch, tone and quality. We also saw the room where Buzard will assemble our new organ - pipes and all. The instrument will then be disassembled and remains on schedule to arrive at Pilgrim early January 2017. It will take approximately six weeks to re-assemble the organ and another six weeks to adjust the instrument to it's new home. So, if you look at your 2017 calendar - you will realize our music on Easter Sunday will be fantastic! Please check our website, as well as the screen in the narthex, for updated pictures.

HAMILTON COUNTY CROP WALK

The annual Hamilton County CROP Walk will be held on Sunday, October 2. Pilgrim has a proud tradition of participation in this Church World Service event, and once again we will be one of 20 local congregations of various faiths raising money and awareness for the problem of world hunger. The goal this year is \$36,000, with 25% of the money collected going directly to Hamilton County agencies. The walk (not a race) begins at 1:30PM at the Carmel Gazebo and covers 3.7 miles, much of which is on the Monon Trail.

We walk in the faith of our Lord when He told us in Matthew 25 & 26 "I was hungry and you gave me something to eat ... whatever you do for the least of these people of mine, you do for me." May we remember the following prayer offered by Canaan Banana from Zimbabwe:

Open my eyes that they may see the deepest needs of the people.

Move my hands that they may feed the hungry.

Touch my heart that it may bring warmth to the despairing.

Teach me the generosity that welcomes strangers.

Let me share my possessions to clothe the naked.

And give the care that strengthens the sick.

In sharing our concerns and our love, our poverty and our prosperity, We partake of your divine presence.

Many of you have probably noticed that the flowers that we received through August 14th were of VERY inferior quality. The Board of Directors voted to change florists to Oberer's, located on Old Meridian Street in Carmel. You will be pleased with the product they will provide us. As with everything else, inflation has won out again. The cost of the flowers will basically double but we will be getting more than double the value in flowers. The total cost per arrangement will be \$40.50. The flower chart is full for the rest of the year. We will not ask those who have signed up to make up the difference unless they

so choose. The current cost has been \$21.00 per arrangement. You will no longer need to return the vase. To those who put flowers in the church: first, THANK YOU from the entire congregation – they add so much to our sanctuary and services; and second, following second service, please take them home, to a friend, hospital, nursing home, etc. – they need to be enjoyed. Oberer's guarantees the flowers for five days but said they usually last much longer. PLANNING OUR FUTURE TOGETHER!

The Pilgrim Call Committee needs your help. Before a new pastor can be located, the church needs to complete a Ministry Site Profile (MSP). This document presents a complete and thorough look at the congregation and its surrounding area so that potential pastors can determine if they have an interest in pursuing a call with Pilgrim. A large part of completing the MSP relies on interviews with all members and groups within the congregation, and this is where we need your help.

We are inviting you to complete the Church Assessment Tool (CAT), an on-line instrument that will help our leaders gauge the strength, vitality, and trends in our church. The information gained from this assessment will be valuable in helping the leaders of Pilgrim as they make decisions about the future of Pilgrim and complete the MSP.

You should have received your email with a unique link to the CAT. If you have not completed your assessment, please do at your earliest convenience. It will take approximately 20-30 minutes to complete and you should complete the survey all at one time. Our future together is dependent on your participation and honest answers.

If you need a paper copy, please come to the office, and we will provide one for you along with a self-addressed stamped return envelope.

All answers are strictly anonymous. We have no way of matching any assessment to a particular person, so please feel free to candidly share your perceptions, opinions and experiences. Our future together is dependent on your participation and honest answers.

DISCOVERY PROCESS

Another method to capture a wide variety of opinions about Pilgrim's direction is through member led sessions called **SWOT** meetings. These group discussions will be conducted through mid October to understand our:

Strengths—internal, positive factors affecting our organization

Weaknesses—internal, negative factors affecting our organization

Opportunities—external, positive factors affecting our organization

Threats—external, negative factors affecting our organization

Some questions to consider before attending a SWOT meeting are:

- What does Pilgrim do well?
- What talents do we have?
- What aspects of Pilgrim detract from our purpose?
- What are we lacking?
- What local events should we be involved in?
- What North Indy needs are not being addressed?
- What are other churches doing better than us?
- What external obstacles exist that make outreach challenging?






LOST AND FOUND


