NEW DAYTIME BIBLE STUDY TO START—A new daytime Bible study will be starting this coming Thursday, September 29th. This year's study will focus on prayer, starting with Jesus' own teachings and models of prayer, we will search the Scriptures to find Him there: the when, where, how, and source of Jesus' own prayer life. And, as a nod to the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, we will examine notable authors writings about prayer, from Martin Luther, to Dietrich Bonhoeffer, to more contemporary Christian bible scholars. The fall sessions will include the Priscilla Shirer six-week study entitled "The Armor of God," and will include DVD segments to watch that go along with the study questions. While we will use these authors as a point of departure, the qoal is to dig into the Word itself, to find those "pearls of great value," and to share our own personal discoveries along the way.

We will have our organizational meeting at Pilgrim on Thursday, September 29th, starting at 11:30 AM, in the downstairs Conference room. During that meeting materials and calendars will be distributed, and additional resources for the yearlong study will be available to peruse. The plan is to meet on Thursdays, twice a month from 11:30 AM to 1:30 PM, with participants bringing a sack lunch. We hope this study time will be convenient to those ladies who have enjoyed the Women's daytime Bible Studies, but if there are men who are interested and available, they are welcome to participate as well. There will be a signup sheet on the small table in the narthex for those who would like to order their student books ahead of the organizational meeting. The student books cost about \$12.00. about Heaven. We chuckle at cartoons depicting Hell's new arrivals. And millions long for immortality who don't know what to do with themselves on a rainy Sunday afternoon. What does the Bible teach about whatever lies beyond the bounds of space and time? And what is "the life eternal" that Jesus promises all who follow him?

- Oct 2 Death and Life in the Hebrew Bible, Sleeping with our ancestors, dwelling in God, a "new heaven and earth," and insisting on justice that doesn't come in the present.
- Oct 9 New Testament metaphors and teachings about ultimate reward and punishment.
- Oct 16 Jesus' teachings on eternal life, riches toward God, treasures in heaven, and abiding in him.
- Oct 23 Following Jesus straight to hell. "They can't keep us out," he promises.
