WHAT'S UP IN WORSHIP? This Sunday we celebrate God's grace and generosity. Our Lutheran musical heritage is a treasure trove of riches, and has allowed Lutherans around the world and through time to express their devotion to God with a variety of musical styles and forms. In our worship today we are blessed with much music from around the world; we begin using ELW Setting 7, the Hispanic setting of the liturgy. The choral anthem at 10:45 is from Tanzania. Last week I attended the Sacred Music Symposium at Tabernacle Presbyterian in Indianapolis, which had church music sessions led by clinicians from a variety of denominational backgrounds. Pilgrim's long time friend (and world renown organist and composer) David Cherwien led the organ sessions. In fact, I will shamelessly steal one of his ideas (with his permission J) in worship this Sunday. Our worship's opening hymn is essentially a medieval dance and our organ will use its flutes and sackbut equivalents to make this hymn leap for joy.
